Gist of ICAI Disciplinary Cases

Clause 6 of Part 1 of first schedule:
Professional misconduct in relation to solicitation of professional work by chartered accountant in practice

Approaching through third person for appointment as auditor

Key issue taken from decided case laws

The chartered accountant approached the principal of a secondary school through a third person known to the principal for his appointment as auditor of that school. He is held guilty under this clause.

Gist of ICAI Disciplinary Cases

Clause 6 of Part 1 of first schedule:
Professional misconduct in relation to solicitation of professional work by chartered accountant in practice

Assistant of member writing request for professional work

Key issue taken from decided case laws

An assistant of the chartered accountant under his authorisation wrote letter to a stranger association requesting for appointment as auditor. The chartered accountant is guilty of professional misconduct under this clause.

Gist of ICAI Disciplinary Cases

Clause 8 of Part 1 of First Schedule:
Professional misconduct in relation to failure to communicate with outgoing auditor by chartered accountant in practice

Non-communication in case of tax audit

Key issue taken from decided case laws

The chartered accountant had conducted tax audit of a firm without first communicating in writing with the previous tax auditor. He is held guilty under this clause.

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Accounting Standard (AS) 1- Disclosure of Accounting Policies

Fact of the case

The accounting policy regarding employee benefits reads as follows:
"Liabilities for gratuity & leave encashment are provided on the basis of annual actuarial valuation at the year end and the management estimates for interim period keeping in view of last actuarial valuation."

Observation

The company has also made contribution to provident fund but the related accounting policy has not been disclosed. Accounting policies covering all types of employee benefits should be disclosed.

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Accounting Standard (AS) 2- Valuation of Inventories

Fact of the case

The accounting policies regarding valuation of inventories as disclosed in case of several companies are listed below:

- Inventories are measured at cost. Cost is determined on weighted average basis.
- Work-in-Progress is valued at direct raw material cost and appropriate cost of completed process.
- Raw materials are valued at average cost.

Raw materials at bonded warehouse stores, spares, consumables, packing material, coal & fuel are valued at cost and finished goods are valued at cost or net realizable value whichever is lower.

Observation

The accounting policies as disclosed in the financial statements that except for finished goods at a few cases inventories have been valued at cost or average cost. In other words 'net realizable value' has not been considered for the purpose of valuing the inventories. Accordingly, it was viewed that the valuation of inventories in all these cases is not in line with the requirement of paragraph 5 of AS 2.

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Accounting Standard (AS) 5- Net Profit or Loss for the Period, Prior Period Items and Changes in Accounting Policies

Fact of the case

Gain on finance lease arrangement and write back of compensation under employee stock option scheme have been disclosed as exceptional items.

Observation

The transactions referred have arisen from ordinary activities of the enterprises. Further, the size of these transactions does not warrant their classification as 'exceptional items'. Therefore, presentation of these transactions as exceptional items is not in line with the requirements of AS 5.

Govt raises insolvency threshold to ₹1 cr to help small companies

FINANCE AND Corporate Affairs Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday announced an increase in the threshold for initiation of corporate insolvency from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 1 crore to prevent small businesses from being dragged into insolvency, besides a number of other measures to ease the compliance burden on companies during the coronavirus outbreak.

Sitharaman also announced that the government may suspend initiation of insolvency proceedings against companies altogether for six months, if the government finds that the situation does not improve by April 30. Sitharaman also announced a moratorium on mandatory filings with the Corporate Affairs Ministry's MCA-21 portal, removing additional fees for late filing during this period.

"We are raising the threshold of default to Rs 1 crore, so that we can prevent triggering of insolvency proceedings for

Sanjeev Singhal, partner at SR Batliboi and Co LLP, said auditors are now required to comment on 50 matters in CARO (including sub-clauses) as against 21 matters in CARO 2016. SR Batliboi is a member firm of EY Global.

Singhal said that in the wake of recent corporate frauds and scams, CARO

2020 significantly enhanced the reporting responsibilities of auditors.

"Though it is the responsibility of auditors to report on matters prescribed in CARO – the companies would get affected as they need to provide the underlying information," he added.

Sitharaman also announced that companies would now have time till June 30 to create a deposit reserve of 20% of deposits set to ma-

ture in FY21 and to invest 15% of the value of debt instruments to mature in the FY21 prescribed government instruments. Ordinarily companies have to meet these requirements by April 30.

Ankit Singhi, partner at Corporate Professionals, said the move was necessary as many companies did not have the funds to set up the reserve or make investments at this time and added that the government may have to extend the deadline or even remove the requirement for the fiscal if the current situation persists.

Sitharaman announced a 60 day relaxation in the rule requiring that board meetings be held once every 120 days for the next two quarters, Sitharaman also said that companies would also

be exempt from the requirement under the Companies Act that at least one director be in residency in the country for at least 182 days in the year.

He highlighted that uncertainty in the economic environment and volatility due to covid-19 has triggered the need for impairment testing. Disclosures are not sufficient companies are required to test for impairment red flags for impairment and there is low headroom in adversely impacted industries and those which have a weak operational or financial position. The evaluation criteria of going concerns may vary depending upon the industry extent and timeline of impact significant to low or which could be given positive in some cases. Example in the healthcare it could have a positive impact. Going concern evaluation in these turbulent times would require significant levels of stress testing and working out multiple scenarios. The auditors and accountants have enormous responsibility in these testing times.

Carbon Neutrality – Towards a Sustainable Future

of the 21st century. Unfortunately, “Emissions Gap Report 2019” released by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) presents that there still exists a big gap between countries’ targets to reduce carbon emissions and °1.5C goal.

In response to the ever-increasing global greenhouse effect, all countries had signed a landmark United Nations climate agreement in Paris on 12 December 2015, to jointly tackle GHG emissions and combat climate change. Under the 2015 Paris agreement, all countries agreed to keep warming below 2.0°C and make an effort to curb global warming to less than 1.5°C by achieving C neutrality by 2050.

Climate Crisis and Importance of Carbon Neutrality

“**T**he Global Risk Report 2022” issued by World Economic Forum states that respondents to the Global Risks Perception Survey (GRPS) 2021–2022 rank “climate action failure” as the most critical threat to the world in both the medium term and long term, with the highest potential to severely damage societies, economies and the planet. Climate change has led to ever more ferocious cyclones and extended droughts leading to the destruction of infrastructure and the disruption of livelihoods. The global average temperature in 2020 was 1.2°C warmer than the pre-industrial temperature, and the effects of this warming are felt globally. Based on the current climate data, there is an urgent need to accelerate efforts to reduce atmospheric Greenhouse Gas (GHG) concentrations to reverse global climate change. In such alarming situations, carbon neutral target must be realised globally by the middle

Box 1. The Paris Agreement cycle and its cooperation mechanisms

The Paris Agreement prescribes that each country “prepares, communicates and maintains successive nationally determined contributions” (NDCs) to reduce global emissions. Under the agreement, countries agree to submit updated NDCs every five years and undergo an assessment process (Feedback Mechanism). In year one, the UNFCCC Secretariat prepares a synthesis report of the newly submitted NDCs ahead of the annual Conference of the Parties (COP). The Feedback Mechanism includes a Global Stocktake of collective efforts to take place in 2023, as well as the review of individual progress according to codified procedures every two years, starting with the 2022-2024 cycle (Enhanced Transparency Framework).

To facilitate the attainment of NDCs, the Paris Agreement (Article 6) envisages international cooperation mechanisms to transfer mitigation outcomes internationally and to promote capacity building, technology transfer and financial support, especially towards developing countries, including the use of carbon credits generated under the Kyoto Protocol and partially carried-over at the COP26 in Glasgow.

Carbon neutrality refers to offsetting the generated carbon dioxide (CO₂) through carbon capture, storage, and conversion within a certain period of time, so as to achieve “zero emission” of greenhouse gases. This concept originated from the Samsø Island, Denmark in 1997, and has been gradually accepted by people from all over the world and introduced into various industries. The promotion of carbon neutrality can not only reduce carbon emissions constantly, but also decrease the concentration of air pollutants, improving air quality. Carbon emissions reduction does not just depend on one path, instead it calls for the synergistic effect of multiple strategies aiming to reduce carbon emissions.

Network for Greening the Financial System has issued “NGFS Climate Scenarios for central banks and supervisors” in 2021. It states that “The world is at a critical juncture where climate pathways could move in materially different directions: from a successful transition to net-zero emissions by 2050; to a hot house world with global warming of 3°C or more by 2100. In the face of such uncertainty, climate scenario analysis is a vital tool that helps

Expectation Gap in Audit

Background

The underlying objective of an audit of financial statements is to add credibility to financial statements prepared by the management of the entity. An independent audit of financial statements is a vital service to various participants of the financial reporting ecosystem e.g. shareholders, management, those charged with governance, creditors, lenders, government, regulators, investors and other stakeholders. The result of an audit is the opinion of the auditor about the truth and fairness of the financial statements audited. The auditor communicates his opinion through the audit report. However, as with any other profession, which is not an exact science, there are certain misconceptions tagged with the auditing profession especially those relating to objective and scope of an audit, responsibilities of auditors, expected outcomes of an audit etc. This results in an Expectation Gap between the various stakeholders and the auditor.

The concept of an audit “expectation gap” has existed for decades. In recent years, due to many corporate failures and frauds, the expectation gap has widened. These incidences have raised questions about the role and responsibility of auditors, effectiveness of corporate governance mechanism and regulatory system. These incidences have also highlighted the widening expectation gap in audit.

What is Expectation Gap

The concept of “expectation gap” has been defined and described in several ways. There is no universally accepted definition of this concept. In general terms, **the expectation gap is the difference between what users of audited financial statements expect from the auditor and the financial statement audit, and the reality of what an audit is.**

1.1 Components of Expectation Gap

There are three main components/elements of expectation gap though there can be several other elements. These components are discussed below.

1. Knowledge Gap – There is a difference between what auditors are actually supposed to do and what the public thinks auditors do. The role and responsibilities of the auditor is misunderstood by public as well as the objective of financial statements audit is not clear to most of them.
Knowledge gap is sometimes also referred to as “information gap”.
2. Performance Gap – Most of the time, the Standards on Auditing or



New Delhi: Leaving balance sheets and tax audits behind, over 200 chartered accountants from across Delhi-NCR, calling themselves the CA Parivaar, are providing free services, including ambulances, oxygen cylinders, plasma and medicines such as Remdesivir. The cost for these is borne by the members, with donations also being collected. In addition, the group provides food to Covid-affected families too.

CA Parivaar, which started as an informal group in 2018, is now a registered NGO and was founded by Sanjeev Singhal, central council member at the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Singhal says pre-Covid, the group largely considered professional problems, but expanded their ambit when the pandemic hit.

Last year, during the first lockdown, we gathered funds and mobilised members to distribute PPE kits, food packets and reusable masks to municipal corporation workers. We also distributed hand sanitizers and dry rations. The current

rent," says Singhal, "requiring a shift in our focus to the oxygen scarcity, the problem of ambulances overcharging people and the shortage of medicine." Singhal explained that the first step was taken when a CA had problems getting an ambulance. The lawyers thought they would buy ambulances but discovered the paperwork would be time-consuming. "We, therefore, decided on a tie-up with a company that can provide us up to five ambulances at any time in any part of NCR," said Singhal.

when oxygen concentrators and cylinders are given to make sure people return these after use. Otherwise, everything else is free," Singhal said. CA Parivaar has also tied up with a medicine manufacturer and guide people on how to procure drugs like Remdesivir. "Once people have a prescription, we ask them to go to the manufacturer, who provides the drugs to them at the market rate, sometimes at a discount," said Singhal. The group also provides free yoga sessions, with six online instructors providing advice via video on the website.

The group can be contacted through WhatsApp on 9811565606 and 9810120222. "There is a core group and then sub-groups on plasma, food, oxygen and ambulances. Volunteers man the helplines relating to food, blood plasma and oxygen cylinder refills. We ask requestors to fill a form to ensure there is no misuse of our free services," said Gupta.

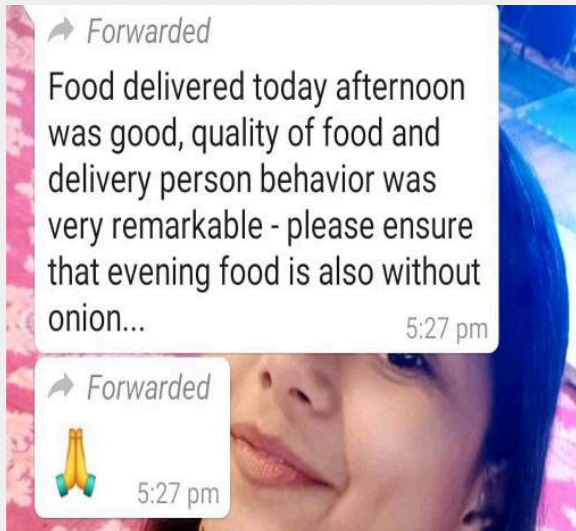
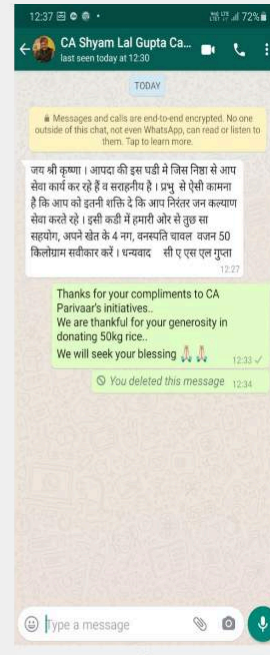
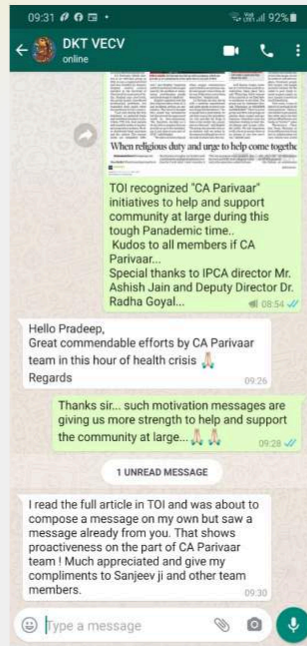
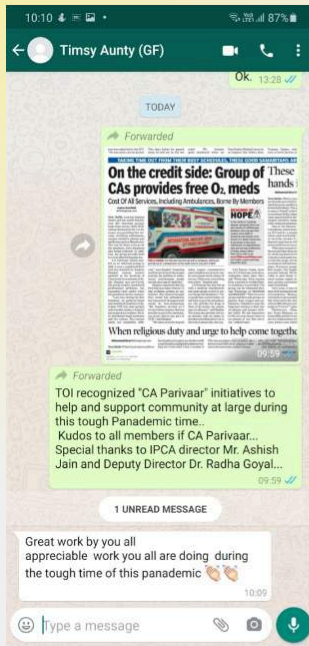
CLOTHES & ROOMS FOR PATIENTS SUFFERING BURNS IN AIIMS HOSPITAL
