The concept of an audit 'expectation gap' has existed for decades. In recent years, due to more corporate failures and the rising responsibility of auditors, effectiveness of corporate governance mechanism and regulatory laws, these incidences have again highlighted the widening expectation gap in audit.

The underlying objective of an audit is to provide assurance to financial statement preparers by the management and the external auditors for a valid opinion to external stakeholders. What is Expectation Gap
The concept of 'expectation gap' has been defined and identified as several ways. There are two commonly accepted definitions of this concept. In general terms, the expectation gap is the difference between what users of audited financial statements expect from the auditor and the financial statement audit, and the reality of what an auditor can do.

Components of Expectation Gap
There are three main components (elements) of expectation gap through there can be several other elements. These components are discussed below:

1. **Knowledge gap** - This is a difference between what the public expects from the auditor and the actual responsibilities of the auditor as enumerated by public as well as the objective of financial statement audit.
2. **Performance Gap** - Most of the times, the knowledge gap is not there to most of them. Knowledge gap is sometimes also referred to as a 'performance gap'.

Carbon Neutrality - Towards a Sustainable Future

The Paris Agreement cycle and its cooperation mechanisms. The Paris Agreement prescribes that each country prepares, communicates and maintains successive nationally determined contributions (NDCs) to reduce global emissions. Under the agreement, countries agree to submit updated NDCs every five years and undergo an assessment process (Feedback Mechanism). In year one, the UNFCCC Secretariat prepares a synthesis report of the nationally determined contributions of the Parties (NDCs). The Feedback Mechanism includes a Global Stocktake of collective efforts to take place in 2023, as well as the review of individual progress according to modified procedures every two years, starting with the 2022-2024 cycle (Enhanced Transparency Framework).

To facilitate the attainment of NDCs, the Paris Agreement (Article 6) envisages international cooperation mechanisms to transfer mitigation outcomes internationally and to promote capacity building, technology transfer and financial support, especially towards developing countries, including the use of carbon credits generated under the Kyoto Protocol and partially carried over as the CDM/CO in Glasgow.

Carbon neutrality refers to offsetting the generated carbon dioxide (CO₂) through carbon capture, storage, and conversion within a certain period of time, so as to achieve "zero emissions" of greenhouse gases. This concept originated from the Samsø Island, Denmark in 1997, and has been gradually accepted by people from all over the world and introduced into various industries. The promotion of carbon neutrality can not only reduce carbon emissions constantly, but also decrease the concentration of air pollutants, improving air quality. Carbon emissions reduction does not just depend on one path, instead it calls for the synergistic effect of multiple strategies aiming to reduce carbon emissions.

Network for Greening the Financial System has issued "NGFS Climate Scenarios for central banks and supervisors" in 2021. It states that "The world is at a critical juncture where climate pathways could move in one direction or another. From a successful transition to net-zero emissions by 2050; to a hot house world with global warming of 3°C or more by 2100. In the face of such uncertainty, climate scenario analysis is a vital tool that helps

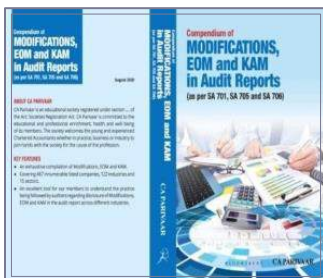

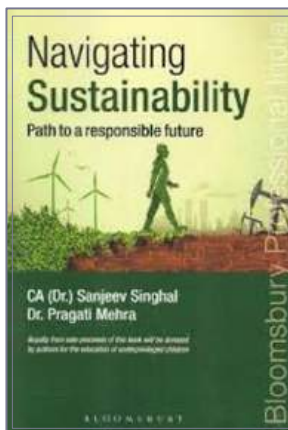

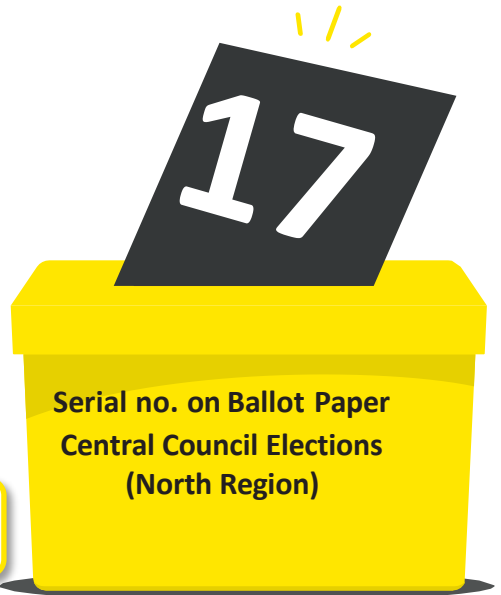
